RECORD PROFITS: Toyota Motor Corp. President Koji Sato (pictured) said Wednesday that the company's operating profit for the year ended March almost doubled from a year earlier to a record 5.35 trillion yen (\$34.5 billion), making it the first Japanese company to top the 5 trillion yen mark thanks to robust post-pandemic demand and a weaker yen. Its net profit for the year ended March 31 doubled to an all-time high of 4.94 trillion yen on its highest-ever sales of 45.10 trillion yen, up 21.4%, the automaker said. But Toyota projects its net profit will fall 27.8% to 3.57 trillion yen for the current business year, as it will boost investments to strengthen its technology development for electric vehicles and artificial intelligence by about 40% to 1.7 trillion yen. The record earnings for the last fiscal year reflect a 5.0% rise in its global sales volume to 11.09 million vehicles, driven by increasing demand for its hybrid vehicles. Toyota and Lexus brands boosted their combined sales of gasoline-electric powered vehicles 32.1% to 3.59 million vehicles.

GUN FIRED: A man fired what appeared to be a handgun on a Tokyo road on Wednesday after getting into a fight with another driver, police said. The driver in his 40s was not injured in the incident around 2:40 a.m. in Chofu in the west of the capital. The two got into a scuffle after their vehicles nearly collided, and the man threatened to kill the other driver as he opened fire toward him, according to the police. The police are searching for the man who fled the scene in a black vehicle on suspicion of attempted murder. He appeared to be in his 40s, with a height of about 170 centimeters (5'7"), and was wearing a dark-colored cap and glasses.

TOMMY LEE ACCUSATION: A woman who accuses musician Tommy Lee of sexually assaulting her during a 2003 helicopter ride will have to shore up all four causes of action in her lawsuit for the case to proceed, Judge Holly J. Fujie ruled Monday. In her lawsuit, the woman identified only as Jane Doe alleges the attack occurred during what she expected to be a sightseeing tour around San Diego. She maintains in her Los Angeles Superior Court complaint that Lee and the pilot consumed alcohol, marijuana and cocaine before the alleged attack. In her lawsuit filed Dec. 19, Doe maintains she was "trapped with little mobility to leave the cockpit" and that the pilot watched as the Motley Crue drummer, now 61, allegedly assaulted her. The lawsuit was brought under AB2777, the Sexual Abuse and Cover Up Accountability Act, which went into effect in January 2023 and extends the statute of limitations for civil actions alleging sexual assault occurring on or after a victim's 18th birthday. Fujie said Doe's current case does not back up her allegations.

Riverside Unified Hosts Renaming Ceremony for Harada Elementary

RIVERSIDE – Riverside Unified School District on May 2 hosted a renaming ceremony in honor of the Harada family and their legacy of striving for civil and human rights. The Harada family overcame anti-Asian discrimination and eventually helped overturn a law in 1918 that prevented Asian and other immigrants from owning property in

the U.S. This is the first school named after an Asian American family in Riverside. "The Harada family's landmark legal battle for property rights in the early 20th century inspired hope for generations of immigrant communities of all backgrounds," said Dale Kinnear, RUSD board president. "By

adopting the Harada name for our school, we not only pay tribute to their remarkable story but also reaffirm our dedication to upholding the principles of equity and civil liberty." On June 29, 2022, the RUSD Board of Education unanimously approved the renaming of Highland Elementary School to Harada Elementary School.

"It is a very great honor for my family to be remembered this way," said Naomi Harada, granddaughter of Jukichi and Ken Harada. "It is wonderful to know that my grandparents are getting this kind of recognition for their ability to maintain the rights of not just their children but all citizens of this country."

Rep. Mark Takano (D-Riverside) posted on Facebook, "While I was in D.C. this week, my team along with my father attended Highland to Harada Elementary Renaming Ceremony in Riverside. I would like to extend a special thank you to the Riverside Unified School District for honoring the legacy of the Harada family and fight for AANHPI equality and rights."

The Legacy of Lumbini

First and foremost, Lumbini Child Development Center would like to take this opportunity to thank *Rafu Shimpō* again for their generosity and continued support. Lumbini was fortunate to be one of the organizations to receive a donation from the Rafu Charity Golf Tournament that was held on March 25.

Lumbini has been serving the Little Tokyo community with dependable and nurturing childcare for almost

50 years. In recent years, the changing demographic of those who work and live near Little Tokyo as well as outside forces like the pandemic have led the daycare center to struggle with enrollment.

Lumbini was founded in 1977 shortly after Higashi Honganji was built in its current location on 3rd and Central in Little Tokyo. Rinban Horyu Ito, the head minister at the time, had a dream that families of the temple and community would have a place where their children could grow and learn and be well taken care of while making friends and learning social skills.

His son, the current Rinban Noriaki Ito, sent his children to the school when they were of age, and more recently, some of his grandchildren have attended as well. Many alumni still keep in touch with friends they made at Lumbini even decades later. Many still come back to visit their teachers, notably, Ms. Leslie, who is the current director and still teaches at the school along with two other long-time teachers, Mr. Danny and Mr. Jack.

"Pre-school is an important first step in a child's life. The more they are exposed to, the better understanding they have of the ever-changing world around them. One of my goals is to be able to provide our students with different experiences each year so they can develop and grow into their world, which gets bigger with each passing year," stated Ms. Leslie, who has been with the center

WWII Camp Wall Fundraiser June 8 at Nishi

The WWII Camp Wall (WW-IICW), will be erected at Columbia Park in Torrance, with groundbreaking anticipated to be scheduled for later this year.

There is state funding to build the monument, but the nonprofit is currently fundraising to build the display stations that will provide educational content for both adults and children.

The Torrance City Council met on April 23 to review applications and to select Mayor George Chen's three recommendations for the Advisory Committee to the World War II Camp Wall Monument Project. The city received 11 applications, and the City Council and the mayor voted to recommend Russell Akiyama, Lisa Akiyama Robinson and Stacey Toda.

This is a five-member advisory committee. Priscilla Ouchida and Nancy Hayata were previously selected upon recommendation of the State Legislature. The volunteer committee will advise on the memorial project, including its implemen-

tation and educational components. A fundraiser will be held on Saturday, June 8, from 6 p.m. at Nishi Hongwanji Buddhist Temple, 815 E. 1st St. in Little Tokyo, to raise funds for the monument's display stations. Ohtani's Ex-Interpreter to Admit Theft from Dodger Slugger

Shohei Ohtani's former interpreter has agreed to plead guilty to two federal charges for stealing nearly \$17 million from the Dodger slugger's bank account to pay off illegal gambling debts, prosecutors announced Wednesday.

Ipei Mizuhara, 39, is expected to plead guilty to one count each of bank fraud and subscribing to a false tax return, according to the U.S. Attorney's Office. The bank fraud charge carries a possible prison term of up to 30 years, while the tax charge carries up to three years in federal prison.

A date has not yet set for him to enter the plea. His initial arraignment is scheduled for Tuesday.

"The extent of this defendant's deception and theft is massive," U.S. Attorney Martin Estrada said in a statement. "He took advantage of his position of trust to take advantage of Mr. Ohtani and fuel a dangerous gambling habit. My office is committed to vindicating victims throughout our community and ensuring that wrongdoers face justice."

Mizuhara was charged last month with bank fraud and surrendered to federal authorities on April 12. He was released on \$25,000 bond.

When the criminal case was announced, Estrada said Mizuhara had an "insatiable appetite" for illegal sports betting, which landed him millions of dollars in debt to a bookmaker and led him to

White House Announces Appointment of New Curator

WASHINGTON – This week, the White House announced the appointment of Donna Hayashi Smith as the new curator.

Hayashi Smith, the ninth White House curator, joined the Executive Residence Office of the Curator in 1995 and has served under five administrations. She began her career as the administrative and collections assistant, then became the White House collections manager and registrar.

Most recently, she was the associate curator of the collections and registrar, a position where she was responsible for caring for and tracking over 60,000 objects in the White House Collection.

She also led the Office of the Curator through its American Alliance of Museums reaccreditation in 2022, ensuring that the White House continues to be recognized nationally as an accredited museum.

Hayashi Smith has been serving as the acting White House curator since the retirement of her predecessor, Lydia Tederick, after decades of service.

"Donna Hayashi Smith brings years of experience to this position, along with unique perspectives from serving under five administrations.

She understands the history and legacy of the White House, as well as the intricate inner workings of the building itself," said First Lady Jill Biden.

"I look forward to continuing our work together to preserve the White House's living history, increasing opportunities for Americans to see themselves reflected here, and making the 'People's House' more accessible to the millions of people who visit our nation's capital each year."

Originally from Wahiawa, Hawaii, Hayashi Smith received her B.A. in art history from the University of Hawaii at Manoa. In 1990, she moved to Washington, D.C. for a Smithsonian Institution minority fellowship at the National Museum of American History and was hired as a museum aide at the National Museum of American Art a year later.

Shortly after arriving at the White House, Hayashi Smith earned a Master of Arts degree in museum studies at George Washington University while continuing her work in the Office of the Curator.

Hayashi Smith is the first Asian American to hold the title of curator of the White House.

Hōkū Zuttermeister is a native of Kāneohe. The Zuttermeister ohana is renowned in both hula and music communities for their many contributions; his great-grandmother and great aunt both celebrated kumu hula. Since hula was woven into his life from an early age, it was only natural that he would be drawn to Hawaiian music and in intermediate school Hōkū began teaching himself to play ukulele, guitar, and bass.

Bolstered by the support of family and friends, Hōkū recorded and released his debut solo album, "Āina Kūpuna," in 2007. The highly anticipated album was warmly received by both fans and peers in the music industry and showcased a style that he describes as "Hawaiian with a contemporary flair."

Hōkū's initial effort was recognized with six of the most prestigious awards at the 2008 Nā Hōkū Hanohano awards: Male Vocalist of the Year, Hawaiian Album of the Year, Entertainer of the Year, Most Promising Artist, Best Hawaiian Language Performance, and Best Liner Notes.

14-time Nā Hōkū Hanohano award winner Mark Yamanaka is proud to call Hilo, his home. A father of two, Mark released his debut album, "Lei Pua Kenikeni," in 2010. 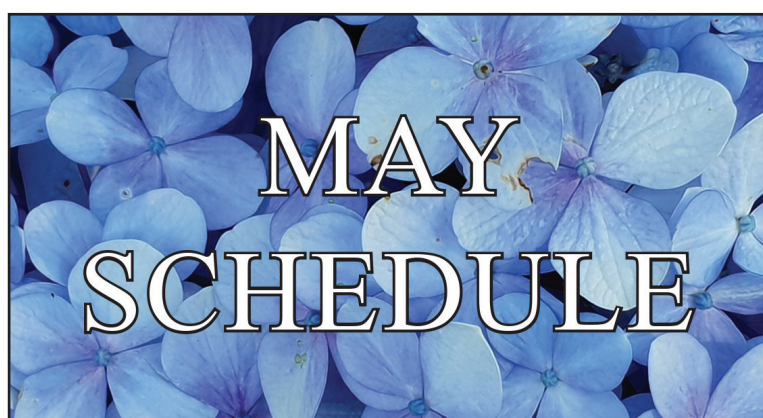

THROUGH THE FIRE By Bill Watanabe

Superstar!

Did you know that one of the biggest superstars of the silent screen era in Hollywood was a Japanese guy named Sessue Hayakawa?

He was cast as the mysterious foreign lover who beguiled young white women on the silver screen before the famous "Latin lover" Rudolph Valentino. He was such a big movie star that his fame and money-earning potential even rivaled that of Charlie Chaplin and Douglas Fairbanks!

As a famous and successful silent screen actor in Hollywood during the 1920s, he lived in a palatial mansion in the Hollywood Hills and threw lavish parties for the glitterati of the Hollywood elite. Wanting to make movies that he thought more accurately portrayed the real Japanese character, he bought and ran his own movie production company and studio.

Sessue Hayakawa was in Los Angeles in the early 1910s and was about to return to Japan to engage in the naval career his parents had planned for him, but instead he became smitten with the stage and decided to pursue acting. He actually worked menial odd jobs for a while as a starving young actor when he

performed his first major acting role – the lead in a stage adaptation of Kenjiro Tokutomi's 1898 novel "The Cuckoo" (Hototogisu).

Hayakawa performed on the stage of Toyo Fujita's Japanese Theater, which once stood at 320 E. First St.

in a Little Tokyo community that was, at that time, young, vibrant, and growing. Due to the success of that performance, Hayakawa joined Fujita's Japanese theater troupe, which performed in Japanese communities up and down the West Coast.

It was through the Little Tokyo

theater scene that Hayakawa and his future wife, Tsuru Aoki, who became a major actress in her own right, connected with filmmaker Thomas H. Ince, who cast both in several silent films in 1914. Hayakawa then went on to become a giant of the silent screen in such films as "The Cheat" and "Daughter of the Dragon," but it is notable to remember that he was "discovered" right here in Little Tokyo!

Later in life, he starred in various movies and TV shows; he may best be remembered by younger audiences for his role as the Japanese POW camp officer in the 1957 movie "The Bridge on the River Kwai," which won the Oscar for Best Picture and for which Hayakawa was nominated for an Academy Award for Best Supporting Actor.

My thanks to the Little Tokyo Historical Society and the Sessue Hayakawa Research Committee and especially Bradly Hammond for the diligent research into the early life of Hayakawa and his days in Little Tokyo. A movie star from Little Tokyo? Yes! And not just a star but a superstar!

transferring money out of Ohtani's bank account without his knowledge.

Mizuhara worked as an interpreter for Ohtani since the slugger joined the Angels organization six years ago. In that capacity, he helped Ohtani set up a bank account in Arizona, which eventually became the source of wire transfers to the illegal gambling operation, Estrada said.

Estrada stressed that Ohtani was a victim in the case and had no knowledge of Mizuhara's actions.

According to Estrada, Mizuhara also allegedly lied to bank officials, and he was captured on tape-recorded calls impersonating Ohtani to "convince the bank to approve large wire transfers of large amounts of money to the bookmakers."

Estrada said Mizuhara's acted "to plunder" Ohtani's bank account to satisfy his "insatiable appetite for illegal sports betting," and he "committed fraud on a massive scale."

According to an affidavit filed in federal court by Internal Revenue Service Criminal Investigations special agent Chris Seymour, records obtained from a source within the illegal gambling operation showed that between December 2021 and January 2024, about 19,000 wagers were attributed to Mizuhara, averaging roughly 25 per day and ranging in amounts from about \$10 to \$160,000.

During that period, the records showed Mizuhara had winning bets worth nearly \$142.3 million, and losing bets of \$182.9 million, leaving him with a roughly \$40.7 million deficit.

Seymour wrote in the document that Mizuhara was acting as a "de facto manager" for Ohtani, and he began placing bets with the illegal gambling operation in late 2021. At about that time, bank records showed that the contact information on the Arizona bank account, which was opened in March 2018, was changed to a phone number and email linked to Mizuhara.

The Dodgers fired Mizuhara earlier this year when news of the criminal investigation broke.

At a subsequent news conference, Ohtani denied any knowledge of Mizuhara's actions. He also vehemently denied that he was involved in any gambling activity.

"I never bet on baseball or any other sports or never have asked somebody to bet on my behalf," he insisted.

Ohtani said Mizuhara "has been stealing money from my account and has told lies."

Estrada said none of the illegal bets allegedly placed by Mizuhara were on baseball games.

According to various reports, wire transfers were made from Ohtani's bank account to an illegal bookmaking operation allegedly run by Orange County resident Mathew Bowyer, who is under federal investigation.

Bowyer's San Juan Capistrano home was searched by federal agents last year. Prosecutors said Wednesday Mizuhara also took money from Ohtani's account to pay other expenses, including \$60,000 in dental work and \$325,000 worth of baseball cards.

The false tax return charge stems from 2022 when Mizuhara falsified his taxable income by claiming only \$136,865, when in fact the figure was more than \$4.1 million stemming from his bank fraud, prosecutors said. He admits in his plea agreement that he owes more than \$1.1 million in taxes for 2022.

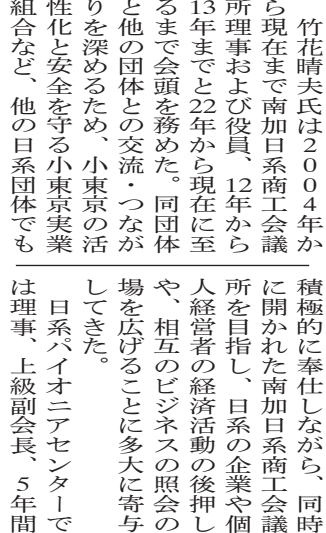

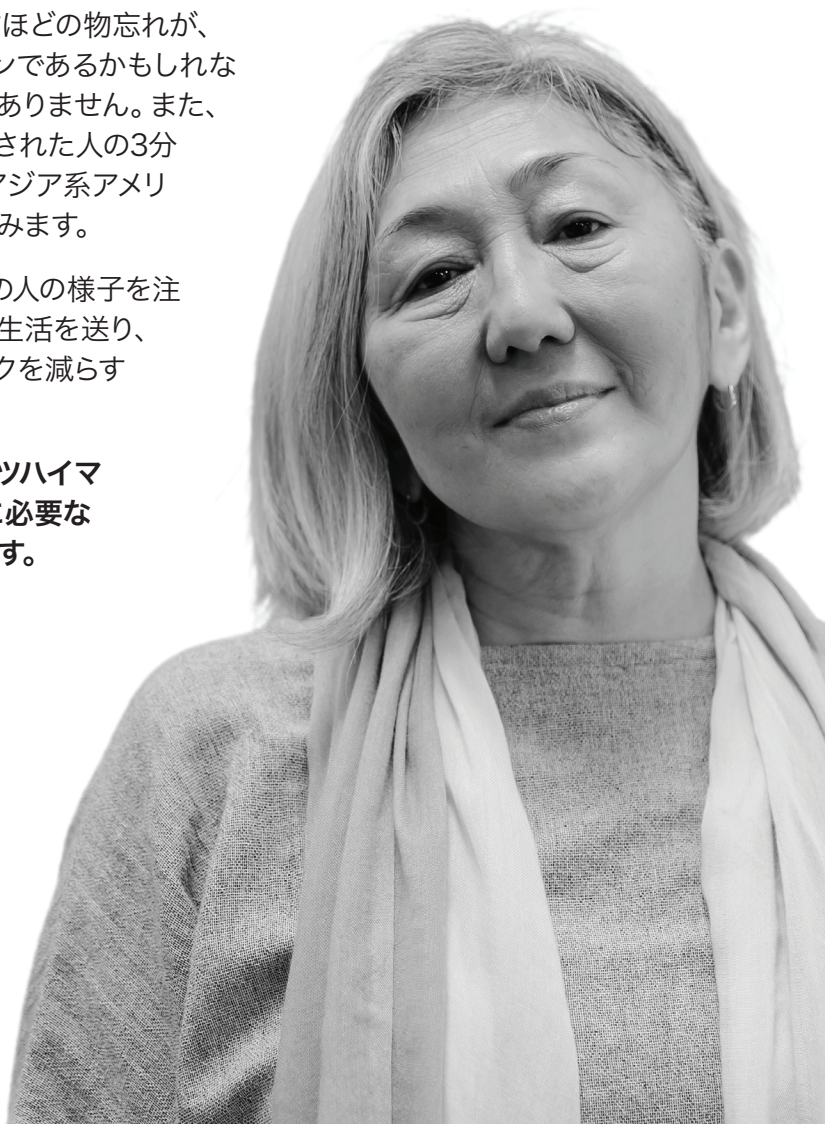
