WORLD RECORD ATTEMPT: World record challengers lock wrists with people next to them on the partially closed Kujukuri Toll Road in Chiba Prefecture, eastern Japan, on June 15, in an attempt to break the Guinness World Record for the longest chain of people clasping wrists, achieved in Malaysia in 2017 with the participation of 4,222 people.

SHIBUYA DRINKING BAN: Tokyo's Shibuya Ward will ban drinking on the street at night in some areas starting in October, expanding restrictions currently applied during limited periods such as Halloween and the New Year's holidays, the ward office said Monday. The local assembly unanimously enacted a revised ordinance to that end. The hours and locations where the prohibition will be enforced will be determined later, with the ward saying it is considering imposing the ban between 6 p.m. and 5 a.m. In June 2019, Shibuya approved an ordinance prohibiting alcohol consumption on certain streets, including near JR Shibuya Station, during Halloween and the year-end and New Year's holidays due to problems caused by large crowds of partygoers.

CHIMNEY RESCUE: Firefighters on Sunday night had to rescue a man who became stuck in the chimney of a four-story Downtown Los Angeles apartment building. The predicament was reported at 7:55 p.m. Sunday in an abandoned building at 1349 S. Flower St., according to the Los Angeles Fire Department's Nicholas Prange. "Firefighters used specialized cameras to pinpoint the location of the man within the 4-story chimney, prior to breaching the wall from inside the apartment building," Prange said. The man, believed about 25 years old, was freed at 10:08 p.m. and taken by ambulance to a hospital for treatment of moderate injuries, Prange said. Firefighters were not sure why the man wound up in the chimney, he said.

GAS PRICES: The average price of a gallon of self-serve regular gasoline in Los Angeles County was unchanged Monday at \$4.814, ending a run of 41 decreases in 42 days, including seven-tenths of a cent Sunday, according to figures from the AAA and Oil Price Information Service. It is 7.7 cents less than one week ago, 38.1 cents less than one month ago, 11.9 cents less than one year ago, and has dropped \$1.68 since rising to a record \$6.494 on Oct. 5, 2022.

Bloc Backing Okinawa's Anti-U.S. Base Governor Fails to Win Majority

NAHA — Candidates backing Okinawa's governor, a staunch opponent of a key U.S. military base relocation plan within the prefecture, failed to secure a majority in Sunday's local assembly election, in a blow to his struggling strategy to stop the project.

The result came as the central government pushes ahead with its plan to move U.S. Marine Corps Air Station Futenma from a densely populated area in Ginowan to a new facility being built in a coastal area in Nago, both on Okinawa's main island.

In January, the state started construction work on a part of the relocation site despite strong local opposition.

In the 48-seat prefectural assembly election, candidates who supported Gov. Denny Tamaki obtained 20 seats, while 27 were occupied by those who opposed him and the remaining one went to a neutral candidate. Before the voting, each side had 24 seats.

As for whether to support the planned base relocation within the prefecture, the assembly is divided with 24 members in favor and 24 against.

"I take (the result) seriously," Tamaki told reporters in the prefectural capital of Naha on Monday, while admitting he "will be forced into a very difficult position."

Supporters of Tamaki include the Constitutional Democratic Party of

Victim of Alleged Anti-Semitic Attack Seeks \$1.6 Million+ from Assailants

An Armenian American photographer who was allegedly hit with a bottle and beaten by two assailants while talking with a group of Jewish men outside a Beverly Grove restaurant in 2021 is seeking more than \$1.6 million in a default judgment against both of his alleged attackers.

Photographer Mher Hagopian is suing Samer Jaylusi and Xavier Pabon in Los Angeles Superior Court, alleging civil rights violations, assault, battery, conspiracy to commit

assault, negligence and intentional infliction of emotional distress. Hagopian's attorneys filed court papers on Friday with Alhambra Superior Court Judge Ian C. Fusselman asking for \$1 million in punitive damages and nearly \$624,000 in compensatory damages from each defendant.

The proposed default judgment would "send a clear and resounding message that anti-semitism is not tolerated in our country," Hagopian's lawyers argue in their court papers.

Dodgers Place Yamamoto on IL with Rotator Cuff Injury

Dodgers pitcher **Yoshinobu Yamamoto** has a strained rotator cuff in his right shoulder and is unlikely to return before the July 16 All-Star Game, manager **Dave Roberts** said on Sunday.

Yamamoto had to be pulled after two innings of Saturday's game against the Kansas City Royals and was placed on the 15-day injured list for the first time in his Major League Baseball career with an initial diagnosis of right triceps tightness.

Roberts said Yamamoto's MRI did not reveal any tears but the 25-year-old right-hander will not throw for the next few weeks.

The skipper emphasized that the club was taking a cautious approach in keeping with its prior management of Yamamoto's health as he transitioned from Japanese pro baseball's less-frequent pitching starts.

"The most important time of the season is yet to come," Roberts said. "And his health is paramount, so for us to be proactive and put him on the IL, kind of reset him, seems like the smartest move."

Following Saturday's shortened start, Yamamoto said he began to feel the tightness in his right arm during the second inning, and let pitching coach Mark Prior know as soon as he returned to the dugout after the third out.

The level of concern was obvious once Prior informed Roberts of Yamamoto's condition, with the manager immediately calling for a relief pitcher to begin warming up in the bullpen.

Roberts said later that some soreness is normal for any pitcher, but the team has been cautious with Yamamoto since his arrival from Japan.

"During a season, they are always going to be sore," Roberts said. "Obviously, he felt — we felt — he could make the start. We wouldn't pitch him if we felt he was going to put himself in harm's way."

Roberts added that communication across languages has not been a factor in managing Yamamoto's condition.

"You have to trust the player if he feels he can pitch," Roberts said. "I've never put a guy out there who felt he couldn't go."

Yamamoto is 6-2 with a 2.92 ERA in 14 starts in his major league rookie season.

Last December, the three-time Pacific League MVP in Japan signed a 12-year deal worth \$325 million, the most guaranteed money for a pitcher in MLB history, after being posted by the Orix Buffaloes.

In Sunday's game, **Shohei Ohtani** crushed a pair of solo home runs, leading the Dodgers to a 3-0 victory over the visiting Royals.

The win, however, was overshadowed by Mookie Betts leaving the game with a fractured left hand after being hit by a pitch in the seventh inning.

Betts' injury came after Yamamoto, one of the key pitchers in the Dodgers rotation, was placed on the injured list.

Ohtani got the team on the board with his 18th homer of the season, a 451-foot blast to center in the third inning.

In his next trip to the plate in the sixth, Ohtani sent his 19th into the right-field seats to double the lead. Freddie Freeman then followed with his 10th home run.

Ohtani's second two-homer game of the season put him one behind National League home run leader Marcell Ozuna of the Atlanta Braves.

For nine-year-old Keita Sakuma, Thursday must have seemed like a dream come true. The youngster was among hundreds who entered a contest to be featured as part of the first Yoshinobu Yamamoto bobblehead doll giveaway at Dodger Stadium, and was chosen to throw out the ceremonial first pitch.

In his video entry, Keita said Yamamoto is his favorite player and he dreams of playing for the Dodgers in the big leagues someday. When the time came for the big moment, Keita didn't merely toss the ball. With the Japanese star himself doing the catching, the kid gave a pitch-perfect imitation of Yamamoto's start-stop delivery and fired a fastball over the plate.

"I'm glad that we won the series," Ohtani said after the Dodgers took the three-game series 2-1. "I've been working every day to try to make my swing right, so I'm glad that things are working out the way I'm hoping."

On Betts, Ohtani said, "He's obviously a very important part of the team, and if he's out for some time, then it's really up to the rest of the team to pick him up so that we can continue."

Tyler Glasnow (7-5) pitched seven dominant innings, striking out nine and allowing just three hits, all singles, with a walk. Brady Singer (4-4) took the loss after six innings of work.

Among other Japanese players in the major leagues, Detroit Tigers pitcher **Kenta Maeda** (2-3) gave up four runs in five innings in a 4-1 loss to the Houston Astros.

In Chicago on Saturday, **Shota Imanaga** held the St. Louis Cardinals to a run on four hits over seven innings to earn his seventh win as the Chicago Cubs triumphed, 5-1.

Imanaga (7-1) struck out six with a hit batsman in a strong 103-pitch outing at Wrigley Field, surrendering his only run in the fourth inning when Alec Burleson hit a leadoff double and came home on Nolan Arenado's sacrifice fly to open the scoring.

The Cubs scored two runs in the home half to take the lead before Imanaga had two runners on bases for the first time in the seventh.

The southpaw escaped the jam by getting Dylan Carlson to fly out to left and striking out Brendan Donovan swinging before Ian Happ slugged a three-run home run in the bottom of the inning.

Seiya Suzuki went 2-for-3 with a walk batting cleanup for the Cubs.

"Getting to generate the same level of power until the end was a real positive," Imanaga said. "I'd have ruined my teammates' efforts grinding out our runs if I had given up a run (in the seventh). My fist pumps might have come out of relief."

The documentary "Baseball Behind Barbed Wire" (2023, 34 minutes) will be shown along with other short films on Tuesday, June 25, at 4:45 p.m. at TCL Chinese 6 Theatres, Hollywood Boulevard and Highland Avenue in Hollywood, as part of Dances with Films.

Guard towers and barbed wired confined Japanese Americans during the forced incarceration of the World War II. This bitter history is told with moments of cheer and laughter as the incarcerated rallied to build baseball fields, play ball and even travel long distances to proclaim their American heritage through their beloved baseball.

GOLF: Matsuyama Finishes 6th, Morikawa 14th as DeChambeau Wins U.S. Open

PINEHURST, N.C.—Japanese golfer Hideki Matsuyama finished in sixth place as Bryson DeChambeau played a heroic final-hole bunker shot to win his second U.S. Open title Sunday.

DeChambeau, a California native, closed with a 1-over 71 for a 6-under 274 total, one shot clear of Northern Ireland's Rory McIlroy.

McIlroy missed a short par putt on the 18th, his third bogey in the final

four holes, that would have put him into a playoff with DeChambeau at Pinehurst Country Club's difficult No. 2 course in North Carolina.

DeChambeau's second major victory and ninth win overall on the PGA Tour earned him \$4.3 million.

The 30-year-old saved par on the 18th hole to edge McIlroy after hitting a superb shot out of a greenside

bunker to set up a short putt.

"That bunker shot was the shot of my life," DeChambeau said. "I want to say happy Father's Day to all the dads out there. Unfortunately, my dad passed a couple of years ago and this one is for him."

Collin Morikawa shot a 72 on the final day and finished the tournament tied for 14th place.

Both Jaylusi and Pabon have ignored the litigation. Representatives for the pair could not be immediately reached.

A cell phone video was recorded of the May 18, 2021, attack, which took place about 9:45 p.m. outside Sushi Fumi, a Japanese restaurant on North La Cienega Boulevard. A group of cars with Palestinian flags arrived with about two dozen passengers and megaphones, the suit states.

"The convoy was there simply to seek out Jews," the suit states. "Indeed, the area of Los Angeles adjacent to Sushi Fumi is widely known to be one of the centers for Jewish life in Los Angeles."

Hagopian was hired to take photos at the upcoming wedding of his Jewish friend, so the two of them and two Jewish friends of the future groom met for dinner outside at Sushi Fumi to discuss the wedding plans, according to the suit filed in March 2022.

Most of the convoy passengers' identities were obscured by hooded sweaters or other garb that partially or fully covered their faces, the suit states. They yelled out anti-semitic remarks, including "dirty Jew," "Are you Jewish?" "Are you Israeli?" and "Be ashamed of yourselves," the suit states.

"Refusing to be intimidated, Hagopian's friends responded that they were Jewish," the suit states. At least one bottle thrown from the convoy hit Hagopian in the head and one other glass object shattered on the sidewalk near dining patrons, according to the suit. "All hell broke loose," the suit states.

Other diners ran inside the restaurant or away from the area, but Hagopian and his friends were quickly targeted because they did not have the chance to escape, the suit states.

"At this point, Hagopian and his friends truly feared for their lives," the suit states.

The plaintiff grabbed a nearby stanchion that had roped off Sushi Fumi's outdoor dining area and tried to fend off the attackers and protect his friends, the suit states.

At least four men, including Jaylusi and Pabon, overtook Hagopian, slammed him against a vehicle and began beating him with their fists and arms while also spraying him with an aerosol chemical, the suit states.

Hagopian suffered emotional distress, embarrassment, humiliation and injury to his reputation because of the attack, the suit states. The attack was condemned by many faith leaders as well as then-Mayor Eric Garcetti.

Japan, the Japanese Communist Party and the Social Democratic Party, while the Liberal Democratic Party and its junior coalition partner in national politics, the Komeito party, are in the anti-Tamaki camp.

There were 75 candidates. Two secured seats without a vote, leaving 73 competing for the remaining 46 seats.

Voter turnout was the lowest on record at 45.62%, according to the local election committee.

The southern island prefecture was returned to Japan in 1972, 20 years after Japan regained sovereignty following its defeat in World War II.

Many residents in Okinawa have long hoped for the Futenma base to be moved outside the prefecture, which hosts the bulk of U.S. military facilities in Japan. Anti-base sentiment runs deep due to noise, pollution and a number of high-profile crimes committed by American service members.

But the central government continues to stick to the plan, decided in the 1990s, maintaining it is "the only solution" for removing the dangers posed by the Futenma base without undermining the perceived deterrence provided by the Japan-U.S. security alliance.

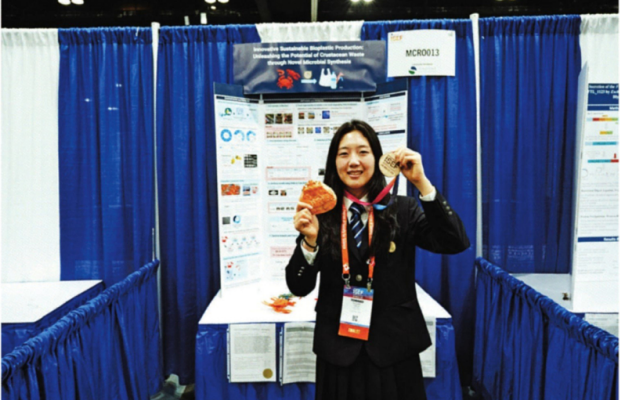

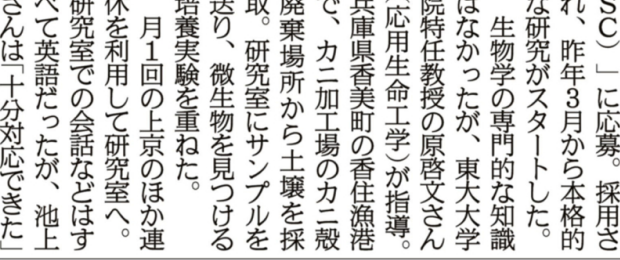

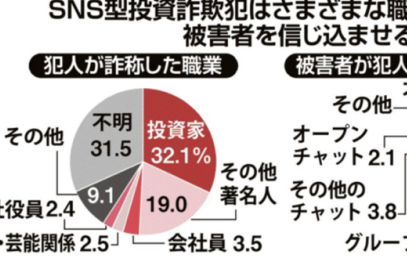
